Students are welcome at school from **8:25**am. The sKids Before School Care Programme operates for those who need to bring their child earlier than this. All teachers are in their classes from 8:30 to 9:00 am. Come in with your child and they can show you their classroom.

- All teachers bring their class to the gate each day at 3pm so they are available for a quick 'catch up' if you need them. Team Leaders, Deputy Principals and Pippa are also at the front gate daily.
- **Please note** that the Grey St crossing is electronic and does NOT have teachers in attendance in the morning. In the afternoon children crossing Grey St walk with a teacher, to be crossed at 3:05pm.
 - The Dawson St crossing is patrolled from 8:30-8:50 am and 3:00-3:15 pm. Please set a good example to the children by using the crossing at all times.

Attendance

At Hamilton East School we hold full attendance (5 days a week, 9:00-3:00) to be of extreme importance for your child's learning.

We hold high expectations for your child's learning, and to fulfil this commitment it is essential that your child is at school consistently and continuously. That way, the sequences of learning

can be followed and built upon, giving your child the best possible chance of success. The only official reasons that students are exempt from this are: for illness, or close family bereavement. Similarly, lateness, interrupts the early morning learning programmes for your child, and picking them up early interrupts their afternoon programmes. Please ensure your child is at school before 9:00, and is not picked up until 3:00. Many thanks for your support in this important requirement.

Kāhui Ako

In 2016 Hamilton East School joined a community of schools so we could work together across sectors with a view to supporting each other in providing the best for our tamariki. This community, Community of Learning or Kāhui Ako has been named He Piko, He Taniwha Kāhui Ako.

The member schools have changed over the last year, and currently includes Hamilton East School, Hamilton Boys' High School and Hamilton Girls' High School. Pippa Wright works with the Principals of Hamilton Girls' and Hamilton Boys' to steer the process and Gaylene Bobsien is the lead teacher from Hamilton East School, who works alongside other lead teachers from the member schools to bring new initiatives to our students. Within Hamilton East, Lynda McKenzie, Shelley Howse and Kat Richmond, work to support delivery of any new initiatives. We all see huge benefits to be gained by collaboration and the sharing of expertise; the building of pathways for tamariki; and their supported transition from primary to secondary learning across the Kāhui Ako.

<u>Parkina</u>

As you will have noticed, school parking is tricky, especially at pick up times. While the weather is fine, we can use Dawson field for extra space. Some choose to park on Memorial Drive and walk up the steps.

Please do not: double park, park on the yellow lines or do U turns in the area near the crossing. This endangers your child, and others...and is illegal. Please do not use the staff parking area for your own parking. This includes drop-offs for sKids. Staff need to access the carpark at any time-and parking is also at a premium for them. Thank you to those caregivers who take the time to use the crossing. This provides a great role model for your children. For those finding parking difficult - try picking up slightly later. By 3:10, there are usually road car parking spaces available.

Change to Lunch Orders

Lunch orders are supplied to the school from our local cafe, ACUPPA . They have recently changed their menu, with an emphasis on freshness and variety.

Swimming:

As you are all aware our school swimming programme has begun! We expect all students to bring their togs to school every day, it is an essential part of our school curriculum. There will be a variety of opportunities to swim throughout the week. If your child is not swimming please provide a written note / medical certificate.

In Week 3 (starting 11 February) we begin our sponsored, professional swimming lessons through 'Find your Field of Dreams'. Kōwhai and Tōtara will be having instruction on Tuesdays and Wednesdays in our school pool and Kauri will be walking to Boys' High every Thursday. On the other days, your child will still swim with their classroom teacher, in the school pool.

If your student is in the Kauri Team we will **need parents to help by walking to and from our lessons at Boys' High.** Please speak to your child's teacher if you think you can help us.

<u>Tōtara</u>

Welcome to all families in Tōtara Team. This year we have grown to three hubs, Kākāpō Hub, Rooms 14,15,16. The teachers are Whaea Maggie, Jenny and Ivy. <u>Kōwhai</u>

Welcome to all whanau in Kōwhai Team. This year we have just the one hub in Kōwhai called Kiwi, comprised of all 5 classes: Room 1, Rhonda, Room 2 Yoshie, Room 3 Shelley, Room 4 Mrs McNaughton, Room 5 Ms Jones. Team Leader is Whaea Sheryl, DP. Kōwhai Team is made up of New Entrant, Year 1 and some Year 2 students with most Year 2 students being part of Tōtara Team this year.

There is a lot happening at the beginning of the year. Stationery is available from the office. Your child's teacher will send home an up to date list so it is best to wait for that before purchasing. Swimming is underway and all students are expected to participate. Kauri

A very warm welcome to new families and returning families of students in the Kauri Team. We have 2 hubs in our Team they are Kea and Tui. Room 8,9 & 10 are the classes in Kea Hub. The teachers in those classes are Whaea Kat (Richmond), Mrs D (Dixon) and Catherine Maunsell. Tui Hub are Room 11 & 12, Whaea Georgia (Cox-Wright) and Emily Speedy are the teachers in Tui Hub.
