Carpark:

Please <u>do not park in the staff car park for any reason</u>. If you are dropping off children for SKIDs, please park on the road. Specific car-parks are used by staff for various reasons. Please do not drive into the carpark area to drop off or pick up children from school. We encourage children to access the school via the main gates. This keeps them safe.

Pedestrian Crossing:

Please use the pedestrian crossing at all times. We model this to keep children safe. We wait behind the road patrol signs, and wait until the tamariki say "cross now." We understand that this is a slow process, however tamariki are trained by the police, and have a specific process that they are required to follow. They are learning. Please be patient.

Crossing the road further down towards Von Tempsky Street, between parked cars and across the intersection is dangerous, and sets a poor example of road safety for our tamariki.
